Agenda Item 2 – Office of Broadband and Digital Literacy Executive Report

Deputy Director Scott Adams provided a high-level recap of various Broadband for All programs and initiatives, including the Action Plan, Broadband for All Engagement, Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) enrollment efforts, including the participation of a number of state entities in FCC ACP Outreach grants, and the development of the State Digital Equity Plan and Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) plan. He briefly reviewed CDT's continued focus on engagement, and highlighted collaborations and engagements between OBDL and other various state agencies and stakeholders.

Agenda Item 3 – Broadband for All Updates

Deputy Director Scott Adams highlighted several coordinated initiatives to achieve Broadband for All, including the Middle Mile Broadband Initiative, the suite of Last Mile programs and initiatives overseen by the CPUC, and the statewide Affordable Connectivity Program mobilization overseen by CETF and supported by the Department of Technology, California State Libraries, the Department of Education, the Department of Aging, and other regional and local entities.

Agenda Item 4 – Middle-Mile Broadband Initiative Update

Deputy Director Mark Monroe provided a Middle-Mile Broadband Initiative update, focusing on frameworks for network architecture under consideration and Caltrans' progress for pre-construction and construction work, along with updated project assumptions and phasing.

Commissioner Darcie Houck from the California Public Utilities Commission provided updates on the various Last-Mile Programs, including Local Agency Technical Assistance (LATA), Federal Funding Account Priority Areas, and California Advanced Services Fund Grants.

Agenda Item 6 – Affordable Connectivity Program

Sunne Wright McPeak from the California Emerging Technology Fund provided an update on enrollment in the Affordable Connectivity Program. As of Monday April 24, California reached 2,085,482 enrollments, the highest of any state. She highlighted the partnerships that were involved in the Get Connected! CA Mobilization effort, and shared a list of all California grantees of the FCC ACP Outreach grant, which amounted to almost \$6 million in funding.
